Under the State Penalties Enforcement Act 1999 (the Act), SPER is responsible for collecting and enforcing unpaid fines and court orders in Queensland. If you want to dispute a fine or court order, nominate a driver, or request copies of the original infringements you will need to contact the administering authority or court that issued it.

You can pay your SPER debt, set up a payment plan and have our suspension on your driver licence removed at qld.gov.au/sper. You can also check your balance, view debt information and update your details. It's the quick and easy way to stay on top of your SPER debt.
