ADMINISTRATIVE DISHONOUR NOTED. LIEN
ENFORCEMENT AND INTERNATIONAL
ESCALATION TO COMMENCE.

Dear Mr Johns and Ms Corbet

I acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 9 September 2025, sent to the Chambers of the Chief Justice regarding your application for judicial orders in equity. Your correspondence has been referred to me for response as Principal Registrar.

On 26 August 2025, you attended the Supreme Court registry counter and attempted to file a document titled "Originating Motion." The following actions were subsequently taken:

- On 26 August 2025, the Registrar considered the documents and referred them to the court in accordance with Rule 15 of the *Uniform Civil Procedure Rules 1999* (UCPR).
- On 27 August 2025, the Senior Applications Judge directed the Registrar to refuse to issue the originating process without leave of the court.
- On 28 August 2025, the Registry advised you of this outcome and provided instructions on how you could apply for leave of the court, including the appropriate filing forms and the prescribed filing fee. A filing fee is required under the *Uniform Civil Procedure (Fees) Regulation 2019*. The registry has no discretion.
- On 2 September 2025, the Registry received your Form 5 Originating Application. However, payment of the filing fee was not included. The Registry advised you that the originating document could not be filed until the filing fee was paid. You were further informed that if no payment was received by 9 September 2025, the documents would be returned to you.
- On 10 September 2025, as the Registry did not receive payment of the filing fee, your documents were posted back to you.

Please note that registry staff cannot provide legal advice. I am satisfied that the issues raised in your correspondence have been addressed. 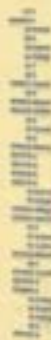
